


Welcome to Lindfield United Reformed Church

'Learning to live with our mistakes'

After a lame man was healed, people were astonished. Peter asks the crowds 'Why?' He explains that Jesus is the long-promised Messiah, rejected and killed but raised from the dead by God. And it is through Jesus that the man was healed. Citing Moses and the prophets, he calls the people to repent of their sins – including failing to recognise Jesus – and to know the refreshing presence of Jesus in their lives.

Failing is not always a bad thing; it can make us want to learn and improve. How do we respond to our mistakes? Do we learn to live better lives as a consequence?

Asked by what power they are acting; Peter speaks about Jesus' death and resurrection. After discussing the situation, and knowing full well who Peter and John were, they order them to cease speaking and teaching in the name of Jesus. But Peter and John said they had to speak about what they had seen and heard. Not really knowing what to do, and wary of making things worse, the Council let them go.

'Journeying alongside others'

On the road to Gaza, Philip meets an Ethiopian court official who was reading the prophet Isaiah – the passage that begins, 'Like a sheep he was led to the slaughter'. Prompted by the Spirit, Philip asks the man whether he understands what he is reading. The man says he needs a guide, and Philip uses this as an opportunity to speak about Jesus and the man immediately asks to be baptized. Philip turns back towards Jerusalem, proclaiming the good news everywhere he goes.
